- 8 Gastown Vancouver's original town site is now lined with hip shops and restaurants.
- Science World Two levels of handson science, technology and naturalhistory exhibits.
- 10 Bloedel Floral Conservatory Houses the 2nd largest dome greenhouse in the world complete with exotic plants & over 100 free-flying birds of various species.

## **GET OUT OF TOWN**

Capilano Suspension Bridge 230 feet above the Capilano River, the bridge links nature with a series of aerial footbridges and glass viewing platforms 100 feet above the forest floor.

Richmond Located just south of airport, this is an Asian food and culture mecca. See North America's largest Tibetan Buddhist Monastery on the "Highway to Heaven", a street lined with stunning temples of all the world's religions.


Grouse Mountain SkyRide takes passengers 3,700 ft. above sea level to the famous mountain views of British Columbia.

## FROM YOUR TRAVEL GUIDE

Vancouver is a young city that makes up for its relative lack of history with a spectacular landscape. The city was founded in the late 1800s by British settlers as a small lumbering village. Originally named after the first man to realize the need for a bar to serve thirsty lumber mill workers, Gassy Jack provided a barrel of booze for the men who managed to build him a saloon in a day! His name has now been transferred to Gastown, a redeveloped area where you will find fashionable shops and restaurants as well as Vancouver's famous street clock. The town's name was later changed to Vancouver in honor of Captain George Vancouver who sailed on many of Cook's expeditions 10 and later explored and chartered the Vancouver area after the British took possession of the region. The 20th century brought immigration from other parts of North America, Europe, and the rest of the world creating the eclectic feel of modern Vancouver. As you sail underneath the Lion's Gate Bridge and enter the Burrard Inlet, one cannot help but feel the majesty of the city. At the end of Lion's Gate is Stanley Park, the epitome of Vancouver's ability to incorporate urban designs into a natural setting. Docking at Canada Place, which served as the Canadian Pavilion for the 1986 Expo World's Fair, is popular tourist destination in and of itself.
